

INTERVIEWS AND OFFERS

You will be invited for an interview to discuss your proposed course choices. We will look at your most recent progress report against the entry criteria for your chosen courses and will discuss your attendance, conduct and future career plans. If we have decided to make an offer, you will normally hear from us in writing within a working fortnight of your interview and it is important that you accept your offer within two weeks



AUGUST-SEPT

ENROLMENT AND INDUCTION

In July, you will be sent the details of your enrolment interview appointment for the end of August/start of September. External applicants must provide their results to us in advance of their interview. At the interview, we will discuss your results against the entry requirements and confirm your final courses. You will be given the details of your induction programme where you will begin your journey as a student of Newman College



What can I do to ensure my child does their best?



- 1 Spend time on the right things -things they don't know

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Streaks




- Jerry Seinfeld, who created used to use the 'Seinfeld Strategy' (also known as the 'don't break the chain' strategy) to form effective habits.
- This strategy is all about deliberately practising a skill each day until it becomes a habit.



Effective revision techniques | How to ensure revision is productive.

5 productive ways of revising materials are:

- Retrieval practice
- **Questioning & Elaboration**
- Concrete Examples
- **Spaced Practice**
- Interleaving



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Retrieval Practice |

Retrieval Practice: paradoxically, forgetting leads to better remembering





STEP 1 - Make a list of all the important information you need to know from a particular unit or chapter.


STEP 2 - Close the books and create a quiz using flashcards or app.

STEP 3 - Try to retrieve everything you remember.


STEP 4 - Go back and check all your answers.



Cornell Note Taking | A system for taking, organising and reviewing notes.



1. Divide the page into 4 different sections



- 2. All information /facts go into the main note-taking column.
- Write key questions about the notes, keywords or comments in the margin.
- 4. Summarise the notes at the bottom of the page in your own words


Concrete Examples | Linking abstract concepts with concrete examples helps you form

real-world examples of success.

One of the most effective things you can do is to get concrete examples of abstract ideas you have learned in class. For example,

Osmosis


Water moves from where there is a high water potential (a lot of free water and a low concentration of solute) to an area of low water potential (little free water and a high concentration of a solute).





Spaced Practice |

Little and often is much more effective than all at once.



By breaking up your revision into 30 minute chunks and spacing out the time between revision, you will consolidate what you have learned and retain the material much more effectively.

Thirty minutes at a time, then a break.









Create a climate to recognise and reward when revision has been done
